Village Blacksmith Shop



Jaeb Brothers --John and Michael

John was the seventh child of Michael and Louisa Josephine Jaeb. He was born on December 29, 1873, in Frankfort Township, St. Michael Minnesota. He grew up on the farm south west of St. Michael, and attended school in the village. John had a special affection for his older brother Michael, who had suffered from polio in his early years, which affected the growth of his legs. They spent much time together through out their early years, and on into adulthood. Besides John and Michael being blacksmiths, they had two other brothers who were very skilled at the trade, Peter and Joseph. In the early 1900's, after having gone to Vig South Dakota to become a butter-maker in a creamery there, Michael would return in the spring of the year to help John with the horse shoeing, and to attend the State Fair in the fall of the year.

After their marriage in 1898, John and Christine Barthel made their home in the town of St. Michael, where John had set up shop as the village blacksmith in the early 1890's.

John's talents as a blacksmith were well-known. Not only did he shoe horses and sharpen plow-shares, but he was also the man people called upon to make nearly anything out of metal. John's crafts ranged from twisted wrought iron planter stands to knives made from old saw blades. Farmers also came to him for made-to-order machinery parts and custom wrenches.

Working with horses and hot metal made John a tough individual. Horses did not dare give him any trouble for fear of his retribution. His hands were so callused that he amused the kids by tossing between his hands hot coals from the forge. Even John jokingly referred to himself as the strongest man in town, and in reality it probably was true. As the age of automobiles started to take away business, John adapted by adding gas pumps in front of the blacksmith shop in 1931, but he continued his smithing craft into the 1940's when he reached his retirement years.








