HOME TALENT PLAYS

Home Talent Plays in St. Michael began in the late 1930's and continued until the early 1950's. They were put on by people who lived in the St. Michael area with local directors and local bands. First the group was called the Ushers Club. Later it was called the Dramatic Club. The plays were held in the St. Michael Parish School auditorium. The plays were entertainment at it's best and were mostly comedy and dramas. Large numbers of people came and enjoyed seeing the live performances.

The names of some of the plays were; "Breezy Money, Deacon Dubbs, Always In Trouble, Who Did It? Wives Wanted In Squashville, My Mother-In-Law, The Man From Nowhere, The Flight Of The Gull, The Unguided Miss, Stop Thief, A Pair Of Sixes, It Pays To Advertise, When A Feller Needs A Friend, Kibitzer, and Stalig 17."

Some of the Directors were Al Lauer, Joseph Korte, Leo Welter, and Joseph Huber. The Band for "The Flight of The Gull" was the Schumacher Band. An admission of 25cents; 50 cents and 75 cents was charged to help pay for the new school. For a play in 1938, they collected \$84.00. For a play in 1946 they collected \$505. 60.

Remember the Party Line

The telephone exchange office in St. Michael was on the second floor of the building which housed the pool hall and barber shop. Old Frank Zachman was the manager of the "Central Office", as it was called, and later his daughter, Teckla, was in charge. After she married Leo Schumm, Stella Killian, who was Leo's niece, took over. Tending the switchboard was a 24-hour a day responsibility so a bed was provided close to the board for the op-erator to use during the night. At that time there were only party lines, no one having a private line except Dr. Ludeman, Father Micks and the business places. (A "party line" is one where each family has its own ring, as, for example, two long and three short rings, or one long and two short, etc.) Some of the busybody phone subscribers, usually the housewives, when they recognized their neighbor's ring, would lift their telephone receiver and listen in on the conversations!
