It was discussed to hold the next meeting at the old Frankfort Township Hall. Wayne Kessler says he would check out their schedule and let Rose Ann Gindele know.

The meeting officially ended at 8:20PM, but many members stayed around to look at historic pictures that were brought in and joined in good friendly conversation, which was enjoyed by all.
